

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH AND CREATIVE PROJECTS AWARD

REOUIREMENTS AND ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must submit the original and three (3) copies of the application by 5 p.m. November 27, 2009, to the Honors College front desk, 2100 UGL . Submissions will be stamped and a receipt will be issued. Proposals not submitted to the Honors Department front desk will not be evaluated

Application Eligibility

The Wayne State University Undergraduate Research and Creative Projects Award funding is officially considered financial aid. If the award amount exceeds your total remaining unmet needs, it may impact the overall amount of financial aid you receive or alter your financial aid package.

All applicants must be current students in good academic standing. Only students graduating in **December 2010** or later are eligible for this award cycle.

Previous award recipients will be considered for new projects ONLY if they have submitted final reports on any previously projects.

Students are **NOT** allowed to apply for more than one project per cycle and **proposals must be written by the student**.

Award Requirements

- Research must begin in the winter semester and be completed by the end of spring-summer 10 semester.
- Mentors must submit a progress report describing the student's work by **April 23, 2010**.
- Students must submit a five page final report by **August 27, 2010**. The report must be signed by the faculty mentor.
- Funded students MUST apply and (if selected) present at the WSU Undergraduate Research Conference in **November 2010**.

Human Investigation Committee Information

Research with human subjects may require additional clearance from Wayne State University's Human Investigation Committee. The process of obtaining a standard HIC clearance, an expedited review or an exemption can take several months. - 2. Project Description (Describe project hypothesis and **research methods** in sufficient detail that the reviewer can evaluate the project's feasibility and academic validity. Describe how the research results will be presented: report, paper, exhibition, etc.)

For Creative Projects

- 1. Project Goal (What new outcome will this project generate?)
- 2. Project Description (Describe how this project will be developed and evaluated. Describe how the material developed will be presented: report, paper, performance, exhibition, etc.)

For All Projects

- 3. Student's responsibilities
- 4. Faculty Sponsor's responsibilities
- 5. Duration of Project (Include projected date of completion)
- 6. Select Award
